Dr. Margaret Weiss from the CADDRA Advisory Panel provided the following information	 The methylphenidate to dextroamphetamine ratio is generally 2-1 or 1.5-1. When converting from short acting medications to long acting medication it is important to take into consideration the duration of action. For example administering Ritalin 10 mg in the morning over 3 hours would be approximately 3 mg/h. Administering Biphentin 10 mg in the morning would be equal to more like 1.5 mg/h. There is no conversion possible between lisdexamphetamine (Vyvanse) and the other stimulants. Choose 1 when making this conversion in general medication has to be re-titrated.
